UC Seismic Program

Background and Overview

1971	San Fernando Earthquake
1975	First Seismic Safety Policy – revisions including building code changes, new seismic engineering practices, and changing business needs at campuses
1978	First seismic retrofit priority list
1979	Campuses and Medical Centers started seismic retrofits. This effort resulted in UC improving hundreds of buildings totaling millions of square feet
2008	Start of Office of General Council and Office of the President oversight of the Program
2014	UC Regents endorse formation of a system-wide Seismic Mitigation Task Force
2017	Aligns UC's needs with a 2030 compliance date
2018	Reassessment of UC's Building Inventory

UC Seismic Performance Rating Policy Implications


Rating	UC Seismic Safety Policy Implication
I, II, III, or IV	UC Seismic Safety Policy compliant
V	Will require further evaluation and, if rating is confirmed, must be addressed in order of priority
VI	Priority for improvement
VII	Must be unoccupied and access must be restricted

University Owned Building Status


University-owned buildings* that require action by 2030 under UC's current Seismic Safety Policy (MGSF)

Since 2021, nearly one quarter of our buildings have found to be compliant after completing these assessments.

Our Plans Moving Forward

- **Update UC's seismic safety policy to establish a continual improvement goals vs. one single compliance date.**
- **Under the updated seismic safety policy, report progress on all UC-occupied space, including hospitals, UC-owned buildings, and leased space.**
- **Continue to pursue all funding options (e.g., GO Bonds).**
- **Support locations in prioritizing funding for the highest priority projects, especially those that achieve multiple campus objectives.**
- **Shift annual reporting for renewal and seismic to be concurrent with the Capital Financial Plan, in November each year.**
